Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment (WEEE) Regulations

Policy Statement by Toolout Ltd (T/A Jointing Technologies) in respect of the Waste Electrical & Electronic Equipment Regulations 2013 (WEEE)

TERMS OF SUPPLY

Jointing Technologies are a specialist supplier operating in the Business-to-Business environment. We are committed to the protection of the environment and recognize that the WEEE regulation plays an important part in minimizing the impact of waste disposal. We will always recycle our own electrical and electronic waste in the correct manner.

Jointing Technologies accepts orders on the basis that its customers accept full liability for the correct disposal of used WEEE equipment.

Where Jointing Technologies supplies a non-UK customer, the local importer or customer should make appropriate arrangements for recycling according to the destination country regulations.

GENERAL INFORMATION REGARDING WEEE RECYCLING

The regulation aims to promote maximum recycling and make good use of materials that comprise of old electrical & electronic equipment at the end of its useful life. Furthermore, it aims to prevent the negative environmental impact of sending this type of equipment to landfill.

Many electrical items can be recycled, saving natural resources and the environment. If you do not recycle, electrical equipment, it will end up in landfill where hazardous substances will leak out and cause soil and water contamination, harming wildlife and human health.

As a reminder, electrical equipment that can be recycled (and should not be disposed of in general waste for landfill), is now marked with a crossed-out wheeled bin symbol. If in doubt, do not throw any electrical equipment (including those marked with the crossed out wheeled bin symbol) in your bin.



RECYLE

Rather than simply disposing of electrical items with your general waste, you should save it and recycle it when you next have the opportunity. There are plenty of places that you can recycle electrical items, for example:

- Use the recycling service at your local municipal waste tip / collection point
- A reputable waste management provider
